

Essential Documents for Damage Compensation Claims

NON-MATERIAL DAMAGE

ADULTS

- a) Photocopy of ID card
- b) Photocopy of police report
- c) Photocopy of medical documentation
- d) Original receipts from treatment (if any)
- e) Signed engagement contract (in printed letters)
- f) Signed power of attorney
- g) Proof of lost income
- h) Photocopy of bank account

MINORS

- a) Photocopy of birth certificate
- b) Photocopy of both parents' ID cards
- c) Photocopy of police report
- d) Photocopy of medical documentation
- e) Original receipts from treatment (if any)
- f) Signed engagement contract (both parents)
- g) Signed power of attorney by both parents
- h) If one parent has custody, they sign on behalf of the child but must provide a photocopy of the custody decree
- i) Photocopy of bank account of one parent

FATAL OUTCOME

- a) Rights belong to (father, mother, spouse, children) grandparents only if parents are deceased. Siblings have rights only if living at the same address as the deceased, regardless of age.
- b) Photocopy of death certificate
- c) Photocopies of ID cards of the injured parties
- d) Photocopies of birth certificates
- e) Photocopy of marriage certificate
- f) Police report
- g) Power of attorney for the law firm x2
- h) Engagement contract for the law firm x2
- i) Funeral expense receipts (black clothing, grave site, coffin, headstone, and other expenses up to 3000 euros)

MATERIAL DAMAGE

- a) Photocopy of vehicle registration
- b) Photocopy of basic insurance policy

- c) Photocopy of police report
 - d) Power of attorney for the law firm x2
 - e) Contract with the law firm x2
 - f) Power of attorney from the vehicle owner if the injured party is not the vehicle owner
 - g) All receipts (towing service, partial urgent repairs... original)
 - h) Driver's statement under full material and criminal liability that the damage occurred on the date and in the manner described in the report
- All except the driver who was driving and is at fault have the right.

RECOURSE - WHEN DOES INSURANCE HAVE THE RIGHT TO SEEK REFUND FROM THE CULPRIT? ONLY IN 4 CASES:

- If driving under the influence of alcohol above 0.3%, for professional drivers it must be 0.0%
- If driving without a driver's license (this does not apply if the license was forgotten at home or stolen)
- If the culprit's vehicle is unregistered
- If the culprit's vehicle was technically unsound and this is proven in court
